# Recycled Content Paper

## New Low Prices!

Recycled content paper now costs less under our new state purchasing contract. The chart below compares prices (per ream) of virgin and 30% recycled content paper for our highest sales volume paper types. All of these recycled content papers can be found on page 746 of the 2007 Corporate Express Catalog.

## Myths about Recycled Paper

**Myth:** The quality of recycled content paper is poor and it doesn't perform well in copiers and printers.

**False:** In the early 90s, the first recycled paper was made available. The paper was brownish in color and not the quality copier paper office workers expect. Recycled copier papers made now are designed for today's office machines and their performance is often guaranteed. Both office equipment manufacturers and paper producers report no performance problems with recycled copier papers.

**Myth:** Using recycled paper will change the maintenance requirements or void the warrantee of our office equipment.

**False:** Office equipment manufacturers claim that recycled content paper will operate just as well as non-recycled paper. No equipment warranties will be voided if recycled paper is used.

## Why buy recycled paper?

### Better for the Environment

Buying recycled content paper completes the last step in the recycling process. For every ton of 30% recycled content paper purchased you save:

- 7 trees
- 5 million BTU's of Energy
- 632 lbs of Greenhouse Gases
- 337 lbs of waste

### It's the Law

**Federal:** Many state agencies are now required by law to purchase products made with recycled content as designated by section 6002 of the Federal Resource Conservation and Recovery Act.

**Kansas:** The federal requirement is supported by K.S.A. 753740b which stipulates that at least 25% of the paper purchased by the state must have at least 30% post-consumer recycled content.
